# Methodology

## Methodology

This study was conducted online among a representative sample of respondents aged 18 years and older.

The sample comprises 1,005 respondents, distributed throughout Australia including both capital city and non-capital city areas.

Galaxy Research designed the questionnaire, a copy of which has been included in this report.

The questionnaire was transferred into Web Survey Creator in order to be hosted online. For each question the respondent had to click on the response which represented their answer.

Fieldwork commenced on Wednesday 6 September and was completed on Friday 8 September, 2017.

Following the completion of interviewing, the data was weighted by age, gender and region to reflect the latest ABS population estimates.





# **Key findings**

## Main Findings

- There is widespread concern about Australia's growing population. Overall, 64% of Australians are concerned at the
  prospect of the population reaching 100 million by the end of the century.
- Population growth is an issue of concern for the majority of supporters of both the Coalition (62%) and the Labor Party (62%).
- Australians recognise and have concerns about the impact of the population growth. These include infrastructure not keeping up with the growing population (73%), overcrowding in the cities (71%) and housing becoming less affordable (63%).
- While older Australians are more likely to be concerned about infrastructure not keeping up with the growing population (78%), those aged 18-24 are most concerned about overcrowding in the cities (80%) and housing affordability (74%).
- The majority of Australians (83%) believe that population growth is of such significant consequence that every major political party should have a population plan.
- Among those that have seen the TVC 91% are convinced that every major political party should have a population plan.



# Main Findings ...continued

- As many as 89% of Coalition supporters believe that every major political party should have a population plan.
- Overall, 17% of adult Australians claim to have seen the recent TVC.
- When shown the TVC, 72% believe the ad addresses a significant issue that politicians are choosing to ignore.
- There is an overwhelming belief that politicians should be doing something about population growth (82%).
- Most Australians (68%) approve of Dick Smith's campaign to raise awareness for the issue of population growth. Only 14% disapprove.
- Support for the campaign is greatest among those aged 50 years and older (78%) and Coalition supporters (72%).
- Most Australians accept that the argument for lower population growth put forward by Dick Smith is an economic one (75%) and not racially motivated (10%).
